

Glossopdale Harriers Privacy Statement

About us

Glossopdale Harriers (“GDH”) is an amateur running club based in Glossop, Derbyshire. We support fell, road, trail and cross country running. The Club is affiliated with the sport’s national governing body England Athletics (EA). Our affiliation number is 3459867.

What data we will collect

In becoming a member of GDH, the Club will collect certain information about you: your name, date of birth, email address, address and telephone number(s). This comprises “Athletes Data”. Optionally, you may also provide the Club with the details of a person to contact in case of emergency.

Why we collect it

We collect your Athletes Data for the purposes of administering your involvement in the Club and participation in the sport of running. If you choose to affiliate with EA at the time of joining (or at a later date), then your Athletes Data will be passed to EA by the Membership Secretary as part of the registration process.

How long we will keep it

We will retain your information for as long as you are a member of GDH. If you resign from the club, are removed for non-payment of subscriptions or are removed for any other reason, your information will be retained for five years.

Sharing your data

We will only share your athletes’ data with EA for the purpose of affiliating you with the EA. If you opt to participate in cross country events, we will pass the information required to register you for those events to the respective organising bodies. We will not transfer any information to any other third party organisations for any purpose. If there is ever a need to change this position (for example, if another governing body requires the Club to affiliate individuals, we will inform the membership of this amendment.

Privacy policy

All of the personal data we collect from you will be collected, stored and processed in accordance with the terms of the GDH privacy policy.

Your rights

Under data protection legislation, you have the following rights:

1. to access a copy of the information comprised in your personal data;
2. to object to processing of your personal data that is likely to cause or is causing damage or distress;
3. to prevent processing for direct marketing;
4. in certain circumstances, to have inaccurate personal data rectified, blocked, erased or destroyed; and
5. to seek redress for a breach of data protection legislation.

Complaints

If you have any concerns or complaints in relation to how GDH collects and/or processes your personal data, you should contact the Club’s Membership Secretary in the first instance or any member of the Committee. If you are

dissatisfied with how your concern/complaint is dealt with by GDH, you have the right to report your concern/complaint to the Information Commissioners Office (www.ico.org.uk)
